

Message from our Spiritual Director

Dear Friends of the Italian Catholic

"A journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step." Join me as we discover how two men found Jesus in the breaking of the bread. Would you strap on your sandals, grab your favorite cloak, and take a walk with me down the dusty, crumbly, dirt road that led to a village called Emmaus? Let us experience the journey with these two disciples as they walk side-by-side in the sun and with the Son. As with all good stories, we must set the stage.

In 1924 the concept of a lay apostolate organization, to unite Italian Catholics in their Faith, community, and pride in shared heritage, was formulated in San Francisco by two remarkable men. It would be called the Italian Catholic Federation, and the men who envisioned it were ICF co-founders Luigi Providenza and Father Albert Bandini. What a great vision as we move forward to the next 100th years. As we looked back, we set the groundwork for moving forward as we walked with the Lord on the way. Like the disciples on the road to Emmaus, who meet Jesus in the breaking of the bread, they begin to move forward with the mission of the church.


Like the two disciples on the road to Emmaus, Luigi Providenza and Father Albert Bandini began a great journey that would unite Italian Catholics in their faith, community, and shared heritage, and to bring back to the church those who had stopped practicing their religion. The Italian Catholic Federation

would share their culture, heritage, and religious beliefs through local Branches where people could meet Jesus on the way

As we look back over the last 100 years, may we find Jesus reclined at the table at our Branches. Because of this great journey, like the two men, who began their journey in sadness, had begun to feel joy, peace, love, and maybe even hope. And then...Jesus broke the bread. Saint Teresa of Calcutta Award Recipients - The Missionaries of Charity

It is very fitting that the recipients of the 2024 St. Teresa of Calcutta Award are The Missionaries of Charity—the San Francisco based congregation of her own order.

Mother Teresa founded The Missionaries of Charity in 1950, with the mission of caring for the poorest of the poor. The congregation began its work in the slums of Kolkata, India. In the early 1970s, The Missionaries of Charity opened a house in the Bronx. In 1976, they were asked to establish a presence in the St. Louis, MO Archdiocese. In 1980, they established a convent in Washington, D.C. and in 1982, they arrived in Little Rock, AR to run Abba House. In all of these places, the sisters cared for the people afflicted with serious health conditions like HIV/AIDS and drug addiction, opened homeless shelters for women and children and taught Vacation Bible School for underprivileged children.

In 1982, The Missionaries of Charity arrived in San Francisco, establishing a convent where they cared for AIDS patients and pregnant women in need.

The Missionaries of Charity in San Francisco provide shelter and care for mothers and men with HIV/AIDS who are experiencing homelessness. They also operate the Queen of Peace Shelter



that provides short-term emergency shelter for adult mothers (aged 18 years and older) with up to two children (aged 5 years and younger). This shelter is located at Immaculate Conception, the birthplace of the ICF. The Gifts of Love Shelter has a 12-bed residential facility that offers hospice care for men experiencing homelessness who are at the end

of life without family and resources.

The Missionaries of Charity residing in St. Paul's Convent on 29th Street in San Francisco do not solicit donations. However, the Mother Teresa nuns in the flowing white robes will "take anything you bring us and give it to

Throughout the 1980's and beyond

the congregation's presence in the US continued to grow, as Bishops requested communities to open houses and minister to the poor in their Dioceses. Over time, some of these homes have adopted their focus to respond to changing needs.



The Countless Ways ICF Funds Have GP Message--Continued Supported Cooley's Anemia

The ICF has donated \$2,308,754 to Cooley's Anemia (thalassemia) since it was adopted as the National Charity in 1982, under the direction of then ICF Grand President David



Botta. The funds have been used in a wide variety of ways.

Early on, before the Federal Government supported research for rare diseases such as Cooley's Anemia, the ICF was instrumental in supporting research that led to improved medication and technology. The advances made are the reason patients are able to survive into adulthood. Now that government grants fund research money can be put toward psychosocial care for patients

The median survival age for thalassemia major in 1975 was about 15 years. Those patients died of heart iron overload. Currently, the calculated median survival age for thalassemia major patients is about 65 years. While this is an incredible improvement, it also exemplifies one of the challenges that all modern children with rare genetic disorders face: while they are now surviving well into adulthood, there are too few adult providers with the special expertise required to manage them. Thalassemia is so rare in the United States that adult providers do not have the opportunity to develop adequate knowledge to provide

quality care to patients. To conquer this obstacle, Children's Hospital Los Angeles (CHLA) has developed adult provider co-management networks between adult providers and pediatric specialists so that patients who have survived childhood can continue to have productive, long lives. Of course, parallel to this is the importance of making sure that every patient in the country, whether pediatric or adult. has access to the specialized centers of excellence. There are only about ten specialty thalassemia centers in the United States. Consequently, countless patients are managed in smaller community practices, as they do not live close enough to a major center.

In Memory of Nettie M. Descalso Former ICF Grand President

December 18, 1933 to June 11, 2024



Nettie M. Descalso passed away on June 11, 2024, after many years of service to the Italian Catholic Federation

Nettie was born in LeGrand, California, on December 18, 1933, to Joseph and Yolanda Bernardi. The family, which included Nettie and her brother Annibale (Al), moved to Madera in 1941 and to Merced in 1946. She attended Merced High School and graduated in 1951. In 1952 she married Bill Descalso, also of Merced, at Our Lady of Mercy Church. They lived together in Merced, and raised their four children, until Bill's death in

Nettie was the school secretary at Our Lady of Mercy School for 20 years. Later in her life, she became a successful realtor She was very active in her community.

serving as President of the Mother's Club at Our Lady of Mercy School. Nettie was active in the Federation in Merced as a teen member, elected as an officer of St. Cecilia's teen branch. She remained active in Branch 39 for her entire life, joining as a regular member in 1961 according the Federation's records.

Nettie was first appointed to the Central Council in February of 1988 and then elected to the Central Council at the 1988 Annual Convention. She served on many committees and was known for her dedication and innovation. She was responsible for starting the Ways and Means Committee in order to raise funds for the Central Council and its charities. She proposed the annual calendar fundraiser and was very active with the publication of the annual yearbook. She modernized the yearbook by supporting its inclusion of color photos. She served as Member-

She was elected Grand President from 1997-1999. (Nettie and Bill Descalso are the only couple each of whom served as Grand President of the ICF.) As Grand President, she was known as a hard-working, positive, and inspirational leader, who encouraged others to be active. Life Member and Past Grand President, Carmen Kilcullen said of Nettie, "Her heart was always with the Federation." She loved presenting the ICF awards at the convention, and it was under her leadership as Grand President that the Federation began giving the St. Mother Teresa

ship Chair from 1993-1995.

She felt it was important for the Federation to look forward while honoring the past. She acted as a bridge between the Federation's past and future. She was instrumental in shaping the Federation's current mission and vision. Life Member and Past Grand President Steve Fuentes remembers she was a leader in the formation of the ICF's strategic planning, providing for its mission and vision for

In April of 1999, Nettie was given the Outstanding American Award by the University of Colorado for being "a representative of the American ideal of leadership and devotion to a cause we all admire." They chose her for her role as the Grand President of the Italian Catholic

Besides the administration of the ICF, she was always there for others on a personal level. Her love flowed beyond the ICF and many of us were blessed to share her friendship. She showed genuine concern and love for others. Steve Fuentes said, "I can't imagine my early years on the Central Council without Nettie's personal friendship, which went so far beyond the Federation. Not only did we share our visions for the ICF, we shared laughter, tears, and many experiences to last a lifetime in our memories.

She was known as a great mentor of young leadership. In fact, Life Member and Past Grand President, Leonard Zasoski remembers, "She was known as the 'Godmother' to many of us because she always encouraged us to take on leadership roles and supported us in so many ways.

Nettie was elected branch President twice. But she is probably best known as chairperson of the annual biscotti bake sale. She guided her baking crew from mixing to cutting and packaging, making sure that each cookie met her high standards. The sale became so popular and successful that it spread to other branches throughout the Federation. She was also known for bringing some fun to the branch and organized bus trips to the local casinos. From the moment one entered the bus until one arrived home. Nettie made sure that everyone was having a good time, adding to the strong fellowship and camaraderie in the branch. She also took the time to make sure that each member, especially new members, felt welcome in the branch. She wanted everyone to feel that they had found a home away home in the ICF.

Nettie is preceded in death by her husbands Bill Descalso (1986), Bill Del Nero (2000), and Tom Pollicita (2014), her brother Al (2019), and her daughter Gina (2023). She is survived by her children Judi (Dave Ferguson) and their children Bryan, Aron, Catherine and Annie; Mike and his children Joseph and Mary; George (Marylou) and their children Daniel. Angela, Stephanie, William, James, and Natalie; Gina's husband Jason Renner and their children Matteo and Giulia. Nettie is also survived by her great-grandchildren Emelia, Luca, Dominic, and Zoey

In Memory of Father Charles Fanelli
Former ICF Archdiocesan Chaplain — Archdiocese Of Chicago

m F}$ ather Charles Fanelli, passed away on July 17, 2024, at the age of 79 in Naperville, Illinois. Father Fanelli dedicated his life to serving the community and the church with unwavering faith and

Fr. Charles Fanelli was born in Chicago in 1945, raised in St. Rita Parish and ordained in St. Peter's Basilica, in Vatican City State, on December 18, 1970. One

of his first Masses was in Lucca, Italy near where his family comes from. Both of his parents grew up in the same small town, Pieve di Compito, near Lucca in the Tuscan Hills. The family spoke Italian at home and Fr. Fanelli visited Italy many times as well as being a faithful attendee of the Italian Catholic Federation's Conventions for many years.

Fr. Fanelli served at St. Mary Star of the Sea near Midway Airport, and then nine years as the Director of the Pro-Life Office for the Archdiocese of Chicago. In 1985, Cardinal Bernadin appointed Fr. Fanelli Pastor of St. John Vianney Parish in Northlake, Illinois. During his pastorate at St. John Vianney he established the first 24-hour perpetual adoration chapel in the Archdiocese of Chicago

After 19 years there, in 2004, Francis Cardinal George appointed him Pastor of St. Thomas More Parish in Chicago, Illinois. Beyond his pastoral duties, Fr. Fanelli was deeply involved in various religious communities. He served as Archdiocesan Chaplain of the Italian Catholic Federation and the Blue Army of Chicago, and was a board member of the World Apostolate of Fatima. Fr. Fanelli also served as

Chaplain to Catholic Citizens of Illinois. He served as a member of the board of the World Apostolate of Fatima in New Jersey. Fr. Fanelli adds: "All my times were filled with troubles and very happy moments and closeness to Jesus Christ. It has been a wonderful experience!'

Fr. Fanelli's journey in faith began at St. Rita School, followed by studies at Quigley Preparatory Seminary and Loyola University. He furthered his theological education at the University of St. Mary of the Lake/Mundelein Seminary and the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome.

His pastoral career was marked by significant tenures; he served as Associate Pastor at St. Mary, Star of the Sea from 1971 to 1978, and Director of the Archdiocesan Pro-Life Office from 1978 to 1985. He was also a resident at St. Bonaventure during the same period. His leadership continued as Pastor of St. John Vianney in Northlake from 1985 to 2004, and later at St. Thomas More from 2004 until his retirement in 2015.

Fr. Fanelli became a part of the Italian Catholic Federation when he was appointed Chaplain to Br. 271, St. Mary Star of the Sea, when it opened in 1972.

He was then appointed Assistant Spiritual Director in 1976 to Fr. Mattei who was the Archdiocesan Director for the Chicago District at the time. Eventually, Fr. Fanelli was appointed the Archdiocesan Chaplain for Chicago and spent many years working with the members of the Chicago District and the Federation to promote our ideals – Faith, Family and Heritage. Fr. Fanelli's favorite saint was St. John Vianney and he was always trying to encourage more vocations to the priesthood.

A Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated at 10:00 am on July 25, 2024 at Casa Scalabrini Chapel in Northlake, IL and the burial was private.

In lieu of flowers, contributions may be made to pro-life organizations or the Blue Army, also known as the World Apostolate of Fatima, based in Washington, NJ, in memory of Fr. Fanelli's lifelong dedication to these causes.

Father Charles Fanelli's legacy of faith, service, and compassion will be remembered by all who knew him and especially all of his friends in the Italian Catholic

Since this year is the 100th anniversary of the founding of the ICF, an idea occurred to me. Are there any saints who lived past 100 years? I did find six, but there may be others. Here is what I found.



ST CALLISTA OF TOLEDO - Callista was the daughter of a Muslim king. She often helped Christian prisoners by smuggling food and clothes to them in prison. When, as a young woman, she became ill, she went to Spain to be cured at the site of some miraculous springs When she was cured she was baptized and lived a life of solitude and penance. She lived from 950 to 1050. She is also venerated by the Orthodox

ST. SIMON STOCK - Simon Stock was born in England, but later went to the Holy Land where he joined a new religious order which became the Carmelites. On July 26, 1251, the Blessed Mother appeared to Simon holding a brown scapular in her hand. She gave it to him as a special sign of her favor. Today, the scapular is venerated the world over. It is worn over the chest and upper back. Simon lived from 1195 to 1295. (Note: my scapular, which I had for many years, burned in the 2017 fire.)

ST RAYMOND OF PENYAFORT-Raymond was a lawyer, preacher and priest. He was instrumental in reChristianizing Spain after the defeat of the Moors. In 1230, Pope Gregory IX, made Raymond his confessor. Raymond worked for many years assisting other popes and the Roman Curia. He is the patron saint of lawyers. Raymond lived from 1175 to 1275.

ST. NARCISSUS OF JERUSALEM - Details of his life are sketchy, but there are reports of many miracles attributed to him. He was, at one time, Bishop of Jerusalem, but many found him to be too harsh and rigid in his role as Bishop. He lived way beyond 100 years, but actual dates are unclear. It is speculated that he may have lived to

ST. PATRICK – Most of us are familiar with St. Patrick who converted the Celts in Ireland. He was the first Bishop of Armagh and primate of Ireland. Available documents indicate that he died at 106 years.

ST. ANTHONY OF EGYPT – St. Anthony lived from 251 to 356. He was a religious hermit, considered the founder of Christian Monasticism. He began to practice an ascetic life at the age of 20 and continued for the rest of his life. He and his followers fasted and performed ascetic practices which were means to attain spiritual purity and freedom from temptation. He lived mostly in the Egyptian Desert near the

You have Questions About Donating Blood? Live to Give has Answers

Laurice Levine, Live to Give Committee

Only 4% of the population donates blood, however 95% of the population will need to get blood at some point in their lifetime. We hope that by answering these frequently asked questions about donating blood that we will be able to recruit more blood donors.

How old do I have to be to donate blood?

Donors must be at least 16 years old (with parental consent). There is no upper age

What will my blood be used for?

The leading conditions/procedures that

- Blood transfusions for Thalassemia and Sickle-cell Disease Patients
- Cancer
- Heart Disease
- Traumas & Accidents
- Organ Transplant Recipients
- Obstetric procedures

Who might be using my blood?

- 1 out of every 10 patients in the hose pital will require a blood product.
- Surgical patients use 64% of all blood
- More than 23 million units of blood components are used each year.
- Every 3 seconds, someone in this country requires blood.

How often can I donate?

Whole blood can be donated every 56 days, or up to 6 times a year. Platelets can be donated every 2 weeks, or up to 24 times per year.

Can I donate if I have high blood pres-

Each donor's blood pressure is taken before the donation, so generally most can donate unless it would pose a risk to your health. If you are taking blood pressure medication and want to donate, please continue with your medication. Taking blood pressure medication will not disqualify you as a blood donor.

How much blood do I have and how much do you take?

Blood usually accounts for about 7% of total body weight. The average person has between 9 to 12 pints of blood circulating in their bodies. Approximately, 450ml (one pint) is taken during donation, which your body will begin to replenish

How does my body make blood?

Blood cells are made in the bone marrow. Each red blood cell lives for almost 120 days before it wears out and is replaced by a new one. Platelets are recycled by your body every 5 days. Your body is continually producing and replacing your blood cells, thus making it very safe for you to donate the small portion we need.

Why should I donate?

There is no substitute for human blood; it cannot be manufactured in a lab. Blood transfusions MUST come from other people.


