Until we meet again, let's keep our Italian Heritage Alive!! Come join us next year!




Heritage — Saint Lucy

Saint Lucia was a virgin who came from Sicily and is the Patron Saint of Light. She was an early Christian martyr. When an admirer mentioned her beautiful eyes, just hearing his words

compelled her to pluck out her eyes and send them to him on a platter. She would not subscribe to the temptation of love. The suitor denounced her to the Roman authorities. The authorities sentenced her to live in a brothel. When she refused, she was condemned to death and subsequently

Her feast day is December 13th. In parts of the Lombardy region of Italy, it is Santa Lucia who gives out presents in December to children instead of Father Christmas or the Befana.



travels on a donkey to bring presents to the children and the children leave carrots for the donkey. The children write letters to Santa Lucia and drop them in special mailboxes. On the eve of December 13th, the children leave their shoes on the windowsill and in the morning, they are filled with tiny sweets.


In Palermo and Syracuse, Sicily, the Sicilians still commemorate Santa Lucia's intervention during a severe famine in 1582. The Sicilians prayed as food was in short supply. Like magic, a Flotilla of ships arrived in the harbor loaded with wheat and grain. Even today, the Sicilians honor the memory of Santa Lucia with a festival on December 13th. They do not eat anything made with wheat but instead eat potatoes and rice in the form of arancini.

Message from our Spiritual Director

Dear Friends of the Italian Catholic Federation:

Christmas is the time when we commemorate the greatest and most far-reaching event in human history. The good news has been brought to us by no less a person than the Son of God himself. He came not as a mighty prince or a heroic king but as a vulnerable baby, born of a human and poor mother. We have become accustomed to the Christmas story. It has been mainly told as a children's narrative, full of angels and shepherds, kings and drummer boys, straw and wise men. We put up little cribs in our homes to remind us of something else amidst the 'presence' of the Christmas tree.


But let us face it. Whether we like it or not, Christmas is generally a time when we cannot escape, even if we wanted to, from the present-buying, the dressing-up, the turkey and all the other things that we associate with this time of year. And that is O.K. so long as we understand that we are commemorating an event so revolutionary, so completely new, so amazing that even the familiar ceremonials and traditions cannot take away its challenge to us.

What is so different and revolutionary about this event? It's just that it was so completely unexpected. At the time of the birth of Jesus, the people were expecting

a Messiah alright. They waited patiently for the one who would save them, just as Yahweh had brought them out of Egypt in the time of Moses. They were waiting for the outstretched arm, the mighty hand that would roll back the sea and herald the good news of salvation. The word of God was to live and dwell among them. And so, they waited for their king to arrive.

But what happened? A baby was born to a humble and poor servant girl. What's more, she was an unmarried mother, even more taboo than it is today. And this baby was born on a cold night in December in a stable! Imagine the scene. How would you have reacted if you had heard that this was the Son of God, especially if you had heard the news from a couple of simple shepherds? Chances are you would have laughed your head off, or you would have said that they should be sent off to the hospital!

And yet this baby was the Son of God, the Word made flesh, the one who would grow up in Nazareth and affect the lives of more people on earth than anybody else ever had or indeed has since. By choosing to be born in such a desolate and poor place, God was making a very definite statement about our value system. Change everything, he was saying, forget everything you once held dear, sell off your riches, give to the needy, share your cloak, follow me. The birth of Jesus in Bethlehem was the prologue to a life of

service and challenge. The stable was an indication of the need for us to see grace and goodness and reality in the very poorest of places. If we call ourselves 'Christian' then this is what we cannot forget.

This Christmas and throughout the coming New Year, my prayer is that more and more you will deepen your union with Christ through prayer and the celebration of the Eucharist and make Him present in our society by your witness and love.

May you and your family be richly blessed this Christmas season and as the coming year unfolds and may the Prince of Peace bless each of you and grant you the joy of his Christmas.


As has become my tradition, the December book review column will focus on children's books. Hopefully, this list is useful when shopping for Christmas gifts for your children or grandchildren.




Jingle The Christmas Clown

its residents. It's Jingle's favorite night.




A Snake, a Flood, a Hidden Baby: Bible Stories for Children

After a very long 16 to 20 hours of travel time, we made it to the stunning city of Assisi. A picturesque place, so peaceful and ethereal. We all felt transported to the Middle Ages, walking in the footsteps of St. Francis. We had a lovely Mass in the tomb of St Francis, then a walking tour of the walled city. We visited the Basilica of St. Francis and the Basilica of St. Clare to see the original San Damiano cross. We visited the church of St. Mary Major, which houses the remains of Blessed Carlo Acutis. We then went to the village of Santa Maria deli Angeli, visiting the Basilica of St. Mary of the Angels containing the Porziuncola, a small chapel called the "Blessed Virgin Mother of God."

On Friday and Saturday, we traveled to Loreto, Italy's Marian Shrine to visit the Holy House of Loreto. We celebrated Mass in the Crypt chapel, then continued on to Lanciano to

visit the sanctuary of the Eucharistic Miracle. Then, we went on to San Giovanni Rotondo, the home of Padre Pio. These first few days have been so magnificent, peaceful, and spiritual especially under the kind guidance of Fr. Chris.


Day 6, on to Pietrelcina which is the birthplace of Padre Pio.

We celebrated Mass at the Church of St. Anna. 

 - Easter: Sponsor an egg hunt at your local club. Join up with another club to do this.
- Keep Business Meetings Short and Focused
 - Provide Written Agendas
 - Take Care of the Day-to-Day at Board Meetings
 - Email Minutes and Treasurer's Report for Review
 - Make It Interesting

ATTENTION BRANCH PRESIDENTS, FINANCIAL SECRETARIES AND MEMBERS 2025 Will Be an Another Open Enrollment Year For The Hospital Plan

As a special offer for the Italian Catholic Federation, the Central Council voted to continue the changes in the Hospital Plan for Individuals and Branches in 2025.

FOR INDIVIDUALS:

During all of 2025 the Hospital Plan will be open to every member, regardless of their age. The age 70 restriction is temporarily suspended for 2025, only, as an invitation for all members of the ICF to take advantage of this opportunity to enroll in our special plan.

FOR BRANCHES:

For any Branch member who becomes a NEW member of the Hospital Plan and pays their \$25.00

in January, February or March, the Federation will only bill the Branch for \$20.00. Thus, for each

Member who joins the Plan as a NEW member the Branch will earn \$5.00.

The \$5.00 reduction is only for those joining NEW in January, February or March. So, you must act right away to get this benefit. After March, the Branch will again be billed the entire \$25.00 for any new members to the plan.

HOSPITALIZATION PLAN – FACT SHEET

The following information briefly outlines the benefits, conditions and costs:

BENEFITS

After ninety (90) days of membership in the plan, the fund will pay:

• \$75.00 for the first day, \$50.00 for the second day and \$25.00 for the third day and any additional days thereafter.

NOTE: A member must stay overnight in an acute care facility unless an outpatient surgery is performed. Stays in convalescent hospitals and rehabilitation facilities are not covered by this plan and do not qualify for reimbursement.

- \$100.00 for the use of the operating room during a hospital stay or outpatient procedure at a state-licensed surgical center.
- \$500.00 per calendar year.
- \$500.00 lifetime maximum per illness.

FEATURES

- Payments are made directly to the member.
- No medical examination is required to join.
- All claims are accepted for up to one year after a hospital stay or outpatient procedure.

COST

• \$25.00 per year - paid to the Branch Financial Secretary


