



In Italy, children do not receive presents on December 25th, Christmas Day. Instead, they receive gifts on January 6th during the Feast of the Epiphany. Interestingly, it is not Santa Claus who brings these presents but La Befana, an old, toothless woman.



The Epiphany is celebrated across Italy with festivals featuring booths selling toys, food, and handmade items. On the eve of the Epiphany, January 5th, many towns host processions where participants dress as the three Magi. Boys often carry torches to light the way for the Magi, and these processions typically end at the local church with a mass celebration. Most Italian families keep their Christmas trees up until January 6th to mark the conclusion of the holiday season.

It fills me with great joy to stand before you today as we initiate our new




leadership. For a century, the ICF has stood as a beacon of values, fostering fellowship, faith, and family across generations.

Message from our Spiritual Director

Dear Friends of the Italian Catholic Federation:

It's often difficult to see the light when life feels consumed by darkness. Harder still, when we lack the support of others to help us navigate through the shadows and catch a glimpse of hope. Yet, even in our most trying moments, there's a profound truth we must hold on to: light always exists, even if it feels hidden. This year, proclaimed by the Pope as the Year of Jubilee, carries a message that resonates deeply with this reality. While many might interpret this declaration as a promise of joy and prosperity, we all fervently pray for it to hold a deeper, more transformative meaning.

The 2025 Jubilee will be centered on the theme "Pilgrims of Hope." As His Holiness Pope Francis so beautifully expressed it: "We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision." The Jubilee began on December 24, 2024, with the official Opening of the Holy Door of Saint Peter's Basilica, and runs to January 6, 2026, the Feast Day of Epiphany, with the Closing of the Holy Door

I think we can see in the manger the model of finding hope that lifts our souls so they may soar! "Hope in a manger" is a phrase that refers to the idea that hope can be found in the birth of Jesus Christ: The phrase suggests that hope comes from the person of Jesus, who was born in a manger, died on a cross, and rose from the tomb. It can also be a reminder that hope is not dependent on predictions about the future or the promises of politicians.

The hope of the world in a manger. Imagine that. This year more than any other, I have been pondering Christ's coming to the earth. His humble and ordinary birth was not by chance.

Like everything, it was strategically and purposefully planned by God for the saving of His people and His glory on earth. We've seen the nativity scenes and heard all the facts, but how often do we experience the beauty of the gospel that came in the form of a baby to serve, save, and reign forever. It is staggering that He came at all! But He did. He willingly came to this earth He created. Emmanuel, God with us, as one of us. Not in the form of an angel or a magnificent creature. No, He came clothed in the weakness of flesh and bone. Jesus became human to endure with us and bear our grief and sin. And in that fullness of God and man, our Hope laid as a baby in a feeding trough.

The Gospel of Luke provides one of the most detailed and vivid accounts of the Nativity. His description captures the humble and miraculous birth of Jesus, highlighting the themes of hope, divine intervention, and the fulfillment of prophecy. Luke describes how Mary and Joseph traveled to Bethlehem, how there was no room for them in the inn, and how Jesus was born in a manger. The scene of the shepherds being visited by angels and then going to see the newborn Jesus is particularly moving and symbolizes the good news of great joy for all people. Reflecting on Luke's Nativity story, during this time of renewal and hope, can bring a sense of peace and a deeper understanding of the significance of Christ's birth in our lives.

Joseph and Mary retrace their steps to Jerusalem, where they find the son, who reassures them in their concerns that he is okay. He says, "Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?

Indeed, the light of Christ coming into the world through such humble beginnings is a powerful symbol of hope, love, and salvation. The manger scene reminds us of the humility and simplicity with which Christ entered our world, bringing with Him a mes-

sage of peace and redemption.

The essence of this Jubilee is a call to remember: no matter how overwhelming the darkness, we must not forget to seek the light. It is an invitation to give thanks, regardless of our circumstances, and to place unwavering trust in the salvation of Jesus Christ. In Him, we are reminded that our race is not merely physical but spiritual. Whatever we undertake this year, let us walk with Him, trusting in His guidance and grace. Let us allow the light of the Lord to shine brightly, illuminating even the darkest corners of our lives.

As we embark on this journey together, we may find strength in His promise, hope in His love, and peace in the knowledge that we are never alone. Wishing you a year filled with joy, hope, and countless blessings. May this year bring you closer to your dreams and fill your life with moments of peace and happiness.

May you and your family be richly blessed this Christmas season and as the coming year unfolds, may the Prince of Peace bless each of you and grant you the joy of his Christmas.

We have 60 tickets for our own private area – "The Saloon" (see photos). The ticket price is to be determined, as we're working on catering. The price will include a game ticket, all you can eat buffet and non-alcoholic drinks. Alcoholic drinks and extra food may be purchased at the game. Time: 6:30 p.m. Gates open: 5:30 p.m. The Rawhide are playing the San Jose Giants. The baseball park is 9 minutes from the hotel and has free

parking! Plan to arrive early to the Convention and attend the game. The Saloon has seating under an overhead with misters for those who want to socialize more than watch the game and stadium seats for those who are serious about watching the game.

The second item is our donation project, which this year will benefit the Salt and Light Organization. They are a local organization in Visalia who transform the lives of our Central California neighbors at risk of or experiencing homelessness by fostering community and belonging. They offer dignified housing, essential case management services, purposeful work opportunities, and outreach programs rooted in dignity and radical hospitality. They have recently opened a village of tiny homes to move the homeless off the street and into housing. Salt and Light are requesting household cleaning items (dish soap, paper towels, toilet paper, etc.) and hygiene products (deodorant, body wash, shampoo, conditioner, toothbrush, toothpaste, etc.). - How to do school outreach or outreach to other organizations.





Statement of Endorsement:

IRS AND STATE OF CALIFORNIA FRANCHISE TAX BOARD

As you are aware, the IRS and Franchise Tax Board for the State of California require annual tax returns to be filed by our Districts and Branches.

It is important to remember that all Districts and Branches now have two numbers - a Federal Tax ID Number for any forms filed with the IRS and a State Tax ID Number for any forms filed with the State

The IRS limit for the tax year ending 2024 is the following:

Branches or Districts with Gross Receipts of more than \$50,000.00 will be required to file IRS Form 990 EZ or 990.

Branches or Districts with Gross Receipts of \$50,000.00 or less will be required to electronically file IRS Form 990-N which is an e-Postcard.

The State limit for the tax year ending 2024 is the following:

Branches or Districts in California with Gross Receipts of more than \$50,000.00 will be required to file State Form 199.

Branches or Districts in California with Gross Receipts of \$50,000.00 or less will be required to electronically file State Form 199-N which is an e-Postcard.

THIS IS IMPORTANT INFORMATION AND MUST BE STRICTLY FOLLOWED

Both Forms must be filed no later than May 15, 2025. The IRS and State strictly adhere to this date, so please take this process seriously.

Any District or Branch who does not file for 3 consecutive years will lose its tax exempt status with the IRS and the State. If you lose your tax exempt status you will have to file paperwork and pay a fine in order to regain your tax exempt status

Included in the Financial Secretaries' packet are materials that the District and Branch Financial Secretaries will need to help them with this process. District and Branch Presidents - please work with your Financial Secretary to go over the information when it is received and see that the appropriate forms are filed by the due date.

Please make sure all District or Branch finances are in order and that Bank Statements are reconciled through December 31, 2024. Remember that the Gross Receipts are total amounts received without subtracting any costs or expenses. These amounts include, but are not limited to, Membership and Hospitalization Dues, Dinners, Fundraisers, Raffle Tickets, Income from Convention Raffle Tickets and Calendar Sales, Interest from all Bank Accounts, Monetary Donations, etc.


Book Review-- Italian Women in Chicago

Italian Women in Chicago Madonna mia! QUI debbo vivere?

Italian Women in Chicago II: Siamo arrivate!

In recent years, two books have been published about the Italian women who



Italian Women in Chicago Madonna mia! QUI debbo vivere is the first volue in the series, published in 2019. This volume is "edited by Dominic Candeloro, Kathy Catrambone and Gloria Nardini...and published by the Italian Cultural Center at Casa Italia. The spotlight has always been on the men. This anthology is a preliminary effort to 'write' that wrong and to focus on women in [an] effort to document and share the full Italian experience in Chicago. The purpose is S.Ô.S.—Save Our Stories! Dominic Candeloro, lead editor, recruited the almost 50 contributing authors; Gloria Nardini managed the section on creative writing, edited individual pieces, and refined the Italian language usage in the text; and Kathy Catrambone edited individual pieces and copyedited the entire volume. Diane L. Cosentino designed and formatted the book for printing...Contributors include some of the most prestigious scholars in the field of Italian American Studies, experienced journalists, freelance writers, researchers and first-person narrators with varied backgrounds. This book is [ground]-breaking in that it increases enormously the amount of published material on the [Italian women in Chicago]. The names of more than 500 individuals and groups are mentioned and discussed in varying degrees of depth. Inexorably, the history gathered took the form of biography.


An anthology is a tool that marks out the territory and invites the reader to go beyond the samples, to delve into original sources for a deeper understanding of the subject. The big picture that emerges is a varied one. Chicago Italian women have been ragpickers, needle workers, midwives, labor organizers, farm workers, club women, county commissioners, lawyers, doctors, dentists, writers, entrepreneurs, broadcasters, performers, homemakers, and mothers. [The book] also offer[s] a Note on Sources and suggestions for further research which mostly lead back to the Florence



Bartolomei Roselli Library at Casa Italia and to the library archival website "Chicago Italian Archives.""

New to 2024, Italian Women in Chicago II: Siamo arrivate, the second volume in the series, "was published by Casa Italia Library volunteers. This anthology is about the famous and infamous in Chicago, and those lives that were only known to their families, with all the joys, loves, losses, and struggles within the Chicago Italian community. It will tug at your heart and stimulate your mind. It will bring back memories of life where it was, how it was, and what it can become. It is a perfect companion to the Italian Women in Chicago first volume, but also stands proudly on its own as a tribute to the women in our lives. It is divided into sections on "Saving Our Stories," "Pop Culture," Entrepreneurial Spirit," "Shattering Glass Ceilings," "Activism," "Spiritual Life," and "Cultural Influences." Within its pages, you will find stories on reality TV stars, playing Bocce with Marlon Brando, the "Sicilian Sappho," of journevs from Rovella, Calabria to Harlem Avenue, modern renaissance women, Saint Francesca Cabrini, Florence Scala, the Maria Adelaide Club and even splitting the atom in Hyde Park. You will also find poetry and book excerpts that include Mezzogiorno in Chicago: Love and Trouble on Ogden Avenue. 2025 IST YEAR SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Information on the 1st Year Scholarship Program that was sent to high schools in November, has now been made available to the Districts and Branches and has been posted on our ICF website www.icf.org via a link on the homepage, under the Scholarship Tab, as well as in the documents in the Officers' Portal.

The **Deadline for Donations and Applications is April 1, 2025.** This will allow additional time for students to apply and for Branches and Districts to follow up with the high schools in their areas.

Please discuss participating in the program by making a donation of a full scholarship of \$400, if possible, or a partial donation of any amount. Partial Donations do help to make other scholarships possible when that money is grouped together. Individual Donations are welcomed as well.

Please encourage your children, grandchildren or anyone you know who is eligible to apply. They can contact their high school counselors about the Italian Catholic Federation 1st Year \$400 Scholarship. They can download the application using the link on the homepage of the ICF website or they can fill out and submit the application, with required documentation attached, online.

These are the eligibility requirements for students:

A High School Senior, a total cumulative GPA (3 ½ years) of at least 3.2 and meets all of the requirements in either #1 or #2:

- I. Are Roman Catholic and of Italian Descent and live within the Roman Catholic Dioceses of California, Illinois and Reno, Nevada (which also includes the other cities within the Diocese of Reno), only where Branches of the Federation are established.
- 2. Are Roman Catholic but need not be of Italian Descent or live where Branches of the Federation are established if either Roman Catholic parent, guardian or grandparent is a member of the "Italian Catholic Federation" membership of a Roman Catholic parent, guardian or grandparent is mandatory for #2.

Again, please contact your local high schools where you would like to see applicants come from and make sure that they are promoting our scholarship program and have applications available.

ATTENTION BRANCH PRESIDENTS, FINANCIAL SECRETARIES AND MEMBERS 2025 Will Be an Another Open Enrollment Year For The Hospital Plan

As a special offer for the Italian Catholic Federation, the Central Council voted to continue the changes in the Hospital Plan for Individuals and Branches in 2025.

FOR INDIVIDUALS:

During all of 2025 the Hospital Plan will be open to every member, regardless of their age. The age 70 restriction is temporarily suspended for 2025, only, as an invitation for all members of the ICF to take advantage of this opportunity to enroll in our special plan.

FOR BRANCHES:

For any Branch member who becomes a NEW member of the Hospital Plan and pays their \$25.00 in January, February or March, the Federation will only bill the Branch for \$20.00. Thus, for each member who joins the Plan as a NEW member the Branch will earn \$5.00.

The \$5.00 reduction is only for those joining NEW in January, February or March. So, you must act right away to get this benefit. After March, the Branch will again be billed the entire \$25.00 for any new members to the plan.

HOSPITALIZATION PLAN – FACT SHEET

The following information briefly outlines the benefits, conditions and costs:

BENEFITS

After ninety (90) days of membership in the plan, the fund will pay:

• \$75.00 for the first day, \$50.00 for the second day and \$25.00 for the third day and any additional days thereafter.

NOTE: A member must stay overnight in an acute care facility unless an outpatient surgery is performed. Stays in convalescent hospitals and rehabilitation facilities are not covered by this plan and do not qualify for reimbursement.

- \$100.00 for the use of the operating room during a hospital stay or outpatient procedure at a state-licensed surgical center.
- \$500.00 per calendar year.
- \$500.00 lifetime maximum per illness.

FEATURES

- Payments are made directly to the member.
- No medical examination is required to join.
- All claims are accepted for up to one year after a hospital stay or outpatient procedure.
